

Rules for Raising a Market Hog in the Barn

1. Students will be responsible for the pen that their animal is in. This pen will be checked daily on a rotation agreed upon by students in the pen.
2. Students will be responsible for the pen duty on holidays and snow days. This does include Christmas day and Thanksgiving if they fall on the day of their duty.
3. Pen duty requires the student to check the water, scoop out any mess that is in the pen, remove feed bags and in general keep the barn clean.
4. Pens will be cleaned out to ground on weekends only if needed, so when you have weekend duty, you will be responsible for cleaning the pen out and putting new shavings in along with regular duty.
5. **Students will not be allowed in the barn without an adult, this means if they decide to stay after school, they should have an adult waiting on them in the barn, this is for school liability reasons.**
6. FFA students will be on a feed bill, \$80 will be due on the first day of each month starting with November, December, January and February.
7. Shavings will also be purchased by the truck load to be used in the pens, cost will be divided per pig that is housed in the barn if we go over our allotted amount.
8. Calendars for each pen will be posted on the kitchen wall after the schedule is set by the students in the pen. Students should sign in when they complete the duty. This will be checked daily by Advisor. After a student misses the third day of duty, they will not be allowed to attend the Perry Trip and will be asked to remove their hog from the barn.
9. No pigs will be allowed in show arena without the owner, and no pigs will be put in the arena if the owner is not present. The show arena is for practice only and must be kept clean.

Money and signed agreement are Due by October 3, 2017

Pig prices are 200, 350 and 500

Pigs of each price 200 and 350 will be picked from the group of pigs purchased at that price. 500 pigs will be picked by advisor at the farm and brought back directly to that student based on what they want.

When pigs are brought back to the barn, you will be given the option to choose from those pigs, or get your money back and go find your own pig. **ONCE YOU CHOOSE TO PICK FROM PIGS, IT IS YOUR ANIMAL.** You must remember that these are live animals that require care. Failure on your part to take care of them or call a vet when sick does not qualify you to receive another pig from the producer.
